

POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN RESTORATIVE PRACTICE MH83M



This Post Graduate Certificate is designed to meet the learning needs of mediators who want to deepen their knowledge and skills for practice in the field of restorative practices.

This highly interactive and integrated programme explores how theory applies to practice and skills development through exercises and role-play which enables the mediator to integrate their career experience and abilities with mediation and restorative practices.

Indicators of the module content are list below. Students who have not appropriate mediation qualifications must complete MC615 module which runs every September over eight days as their first module.

MC615: Mediation Knowledge & Practice (year 2019 -2020): This module is designed to provide knowledge and skills in conflict resolution and mediation. It is compulsory for those students who have not already obtained appropriate certification as a mediator. The Mediators Institute Ireland (MII) has approved this module as a Certificate Training for mediators. It is a highly interactive and integrated programme bringing together the essential knowledge skills and attitudes for the work of facilitating the resolution of emotion and interest based conflict. Students who pass assessment on this module may register with the MII as a certified mediator eligible to practice.

Restorative Practice in Schools MC616 (year 2020-2021): Transformative learning relationships with students, parents, staff, Boards of Management and the wider society, principles, theories and philosophy of a restorative approach, processes and practices of language, circles, conferencing and interventions that allow a school community to enhance their positive ethos and move towards being a Restorative School.

Restorative Practice Core Concepts MC608 (year 2019-2020): methods and skills of restorative methodology and practice, philosophy of restorative practice and contexts in which it can be applied. This module is delivered by staff of the Faculty of Social Science at the University of Ulster and includes a two-day experiential visit to restorative programmes in Belfast.

Values and Relationship in Conflict Intervention MC606: (year 2019/2020): Core principles guiding mediation practice, problem solving mediation, transformative mediation, conflict coaching, reflective practice, ethical debates.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants will be required to have all of the following:

- A primary degree in any subject.
- Career or life experience relevant to mediation & conflict intervention.
- Interview.

Applicants without a primary degree may be considered if they have:

- A Maynooth University Diploma in Mediation & Conflict Intervention.
- A Maynooth University Certificate in Mediation and Restorative Practice

OR if they have all of the following:

- A Certified Mediation Training and a Mediation Role Play Competency Assessment (accredited by the Mediators Institute of Ireland or equivalent) AND
- An extensive career portfolio of not less than 10 years in total, including at least three years' practice as a mediator.
- Interview.

COURSE STRUCTURE:

The programme is delivered as part of our ongoing Masters programme in Mediation & Conflict Intervention. This Post Graduate Certificate in Restorative Practice consists of two modules of 6 days each. Each 6-day module in turn is broken down into two 3 day blocks from Thursday to Saturday. In case of MC608 the module is in three two day blocks.
